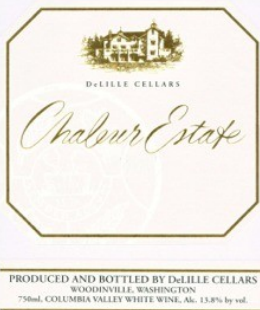

### 2005 Col Solare Red Blend — \$75

Rich and balanced on the palate, this wine finishes with long, lingering flavors of cocoa, black fruits, and vanilla. Col Solare is the partnership between two influential wine producers who are recognized leaders in their respective regions: Tuscany's Marchesi Antinori and Washington State's Chateau Ste. Michelle. Col Solare, Italian for "shining hill," realizes the partners' mission to unite two unique viticultural and winemaking cultures to produce an ultra-luxury Cabernet Sauvignon-based wine. 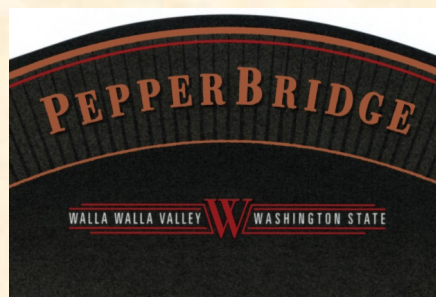


### 2006 DeLille Cellars Chaleur Estate Red — \$75

From its black-purple robe and the nose of blackberries, blueberries, violets, and Asian spice, you know you are about ready to enjoy Chaleur Estate. The palate is concentrated and fresh, dense with black fruits, vanilla cream, and cardamon spice notes, with a lingering and balanced finish. 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 25% Merlot, 8% Cabernet Franc & 2% Petit Verdot. ### 2006 Doyenne Grand Ciel Vineyard Syrah, Red Mountain — \$75

This is a powerhouse Syrah from the estate vineyard on Red Mountain. It shows a deep, bluish ruby color and intense blackberry, wild currant aromas with scents of violets, lavender and crushed roses. The flavors are thick and meaty, loaded with dark fruits, yet exquisite, with undertones of scorched earth, kirsch liqueur, and vanilla bean, followed by a long sweet tannin finish. ### 2006 Pepper Bridge Merlot, Walla Walla Valley — \$50

This Merlot is densely packed with luscious, intense flavors of ripe currants, black cherries and Italian plums. Hints of Asian spices and floral notes mingle with touches of chocolate mousse, nutmeg, cinnamon and earth scents. Rich, layered and concentrated, this plush Merlot finishes with a smooth, refined elegance. 92% Merlot, 3% Cabernet Sauvignon, 3% Malbec and 2% Cabernet Franc (100% Walla Walla Valley). 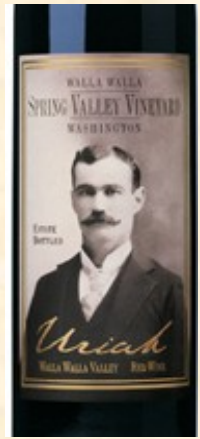
**2006 Spring Valley Vineyard Uriah, Walla Walla Valley — \$50**

This wine has a nose of complex dark fruit with hints of cedar, crushed stone, and dry herbs leads into black fruit, licorice, and grenadine syrup on the palate. The perfectly integrated oak leaves no edge and the huge tannins are packed and concentrated but melt on the mouth. This wine has great aging potential and can be enjoyed now. The wine is a blend of 54% Merlot, 33% Cabernet Franc, 7% Petit Verdot and 6% Malbec. Serge Laville, Winemaker

**2006 Erath Prince Hill Pinot Noir, Oregon — \$45**

Indulgent aromas of ripe boysenberry and black cherry are an irresistible invitation to sink into this plush Pinot. A mouthful of mocha, praline and graham take you on a hedonistic journey that ebbs and flows without losing momentum. A beautiful mouth feel and a gloriously long finish crown this 'princely' vintage. Prince Hill Vineyard is known for consistently producing wines with a deep, saturated color and complex flavors. **2005 L'Ecole No. 41 Perigee, Seven Hills Vineyard, Walla Walla Valley — \$45**

The wine is 56% Cabernet Sauvignon, 36% Merlot, and 8% Cabernet Franc aged in 50% new oak. Dark ruby/purple-colored, it has an alluring perfume of violets, wood smoke, spice box, black currant and blackberry liqueur. Elegant and seamless on the palate, it has superb depth, concentration, and spicy, savory flavors. Drink it from 2012 to 2025. Martin Clubb, Winemaker

**2006 Chateau Ste. Michelle Canoe Ridge Estate Cabernet Sauvignon, Horse Heaven Hills — \$30**

The Canoe Ridge Estate Cabernet typifies the Horse Heaven Hills AVA with beautiful, expressive fruit and delicate tannins. This wine sports an alluring nose of cedar, cinnamon, allspice, violets, black currant, and blackberry. Layered, bordering on opulent, this full-flavored Cabernet has excellent density, savory flavors, ripe tannins, and plenty of length. Bob Bertheau, Winemaker

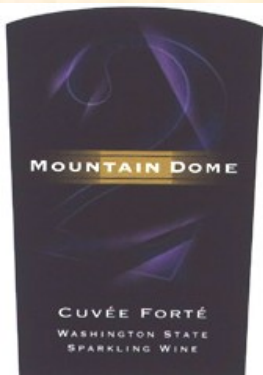
**2006 Cougar Crest Estate Grown Cabernet Sauvignon,  
Walla Walla Valley — \$30**

85% Cabernet Sauvignon and 15% Merlot, all from Stellar Vineyard and Cougar Hills Vineyard. Dense, dark ruby color and aromas of blackberry, currants, licorice, herbs, and mocha fill the senses. The palate reveals finely textured tannins, balanced acidity, and a mouth feel that is smooth and lush. The long, reverberating finish leaves lasting impressions of cassis, leather, and toast.

**Mountain Dome Cuvée Forte, Non Vintage — \$30**

A special blend of Pinot Noir, Chardonnay and Pinot Meunier from 4 separate vineyards. The growing conditions at the vineyards, in 1995, were ideal for making a Tété de Cuvée. Whisky Creek vineyards, near Walla Walla, has four separate clones of Pinot Noir which adds diversity to Mountain Dome's style of strength and complexity. The French oak barrels also add depth to this wine and the long period of sur lees (bottle aging) offers a wine that is rich in texture, full bodied, and finished in the brut style.

**2007 Buty Semillon-Sauvignon Blanc-Muscadelle, Columbia Valley — \$25**

Semillon dominates our classic white blend sourced from the old vines of Rosebud Ranches Vineyard on the Wahluke Slope. The sand, silt-loam filled soils and cooler temperatures of Spring Creek Vineyard in the Yakima Valley nurture our sauvignon bringing bright acidity to the blend. Muscadelle from Lonesome Spring River Ranch is responsible for the florals in this verve-filled wine. Thirty barrels produced. Caleb Foster, Winemaker

**2008 Eroica Riesling, Columbia Valley — \$25**

Eroica is an elegant off-dry Washington Riesling that has blazed a trail for high-end American Riesling. Eroica delivers a unique combination of mandarin orange aromas characteristic of Washington state Rieslings, melded with the mineral and slate notes and lively, crisp acidity associated with German Riesling. The wine's crisp acidity and touch of sweetness makes it a tremendously versatile and food friendly wine. Bob Bertheau, Winemaker
