Samaritan Occupational Medicine

Samaritan Healthcare's new occupational medicine department focuses on creating a healthier workforce by caring for employees' preventive health and treating their injuries, illnesses, and disabilities that happen while they're at work.

Our occupational medicine department is led by Brandon Penix, DO. He partners with area businesses to provide services such as pre-employment physicals, drug screenings, return-to-work evaluations, immunizations, and DOT certifications. He also manages workers' compensation cases and works closely with personal injury attorneys to complete independent medical exams.

"As an occupational medicine physician, I advocate for both my patients and their employers," said Dr. Penix. "I partner with my patients to provide preventive health screenings and immunizations, and I treat their work-related illness and injuries and help them return to work quickly. Employees are healthier, and businesses benefit from increased productivity and a reduction in workers compensation expenses."

Dr. Penix has years of experience in occupational medicine. He completed his residency at the University of Colorado in Denver, Colorado, where he provided care for all City of Denver employees including the fire, public works, and police departments. Dr. Penix also served in the United States Army as a General Medical Officer, where he evaluated wounded soldiers' fitness-for-duty. Dr. Penix is part of the Washington State Department of Labor & Industries' Medical Provider Network (MPN), as well as a certified DOT Medical Examiner, and a licensed Medical Review Officer (MRO).



"Healing is more than just understanding the mechanics of a disease. Understanding the entirety of a person is critical—the things they've learned, the way they approach their condition, and their life experiences," said Dr. Karnik. "Knowing the patient helps me to design individual treatment plans that work best for them."

Dr. George Hneich is dual board-certified in Psychiatry and Geriatric Psychiatry. Dr. Hneich specializes in preventing, diagnosing, and treating mental, behavioral, and emotional disorders in adults. He focuses on putting the patient first and working with them to create a care plan, which may include a mix of therapies and medications.

Dr. Hneich is also a fluent Spanish speaker, which allows him to communicate more easily with patients whose primary language is not English.

"Every patient is different in different ways, but they can all get better," said Dr. Hneich. "Watching my patients' mental health improve and seeing them become functional again—and enjoying their daily lives again—is very rewarding."

Board-certified psychiatric-mental health nurse practitioner **Brittany Kesten** has joined Samaritan's Behavior Health team. Brittany has spent her entire career in mental health, caring for patients of all ages—young children to adults. She diagnoses mental health disorders and provides therapy sessions. She also educates patients about their diagnoses, medications, and behavioral modifications. Connecting with her patients is what brings Brittany joy—she sees patients as people, not as symptoms, and not as a diagnosis.

"It's a sign of strength to ask for help when you need it," said Brittany Kesten. "It's not a sign of weakness to ask for help, and there is no reason to continue to suffer unnecessarily when help is available. I'm here to help." 5

Samaritan High-Risk Pregnancy Services

Partnership with Providence brings specialty maternity care closer to home.

f you're pregnant and require additional screening due to highrisk medical conditions or risk factors such as diabetes, advanced maternal age, an abnormal genetic screening, or other conditions, you no longer have to travel far to receive care.

Samaritan Healthcare Obstetrics & Gynecology, in collaboration with Providence Medical Group, now offers state-of-the-art Level 2 anatomy ultrasounds and additional specialty care at Samaritan Clinic on Pioneer.

"Our ability to perform both Level 1 and Level 2 anatomy ultrasounds means mothers-to-be who live in Moses Lake and our surrounding communities don't have to travel to Seattle or Spokane to receive the diagnostic imaging they need for a high-risk pregnancy," said Ryan Rasmussen, MD, OB/GYN at Samaritan Healthcare.

The ultrasounds performed at Samaritan are interpreted by fellowship-trained Maternal Fetal Medicine specialists at Providence Sacred Heart Medical Center in Spokane. The findings are sent to the patient's local provider, who may further collaborate with Providence to coordinate intervening measures or specialists, or to provide specialty care via telehealth.

"Providence's collaboration with Samaritan Healthcare helps extend clinical expertise for those who may be experiencing a high-risk pregnancy," says Douglas Barber, MD, medical director for Providence's Maternal-Fetal Medicine program and Providence High Risk Pregnancy Clinic. "By providing these services through our telehealth program, we are able to keep patients closer to home and minimize trips to Spokane. And if they should need to come to Spokane, patients are already connected to our specialists and the region's only children's hospital."

If your pregnancy is considered high risk, speak with your OB provider to receive a referral to Samaritan Clinic and Providence High Risk Pregnancy Clinic.



Receive specialized care and treatment for many issues including:

- Alcohol, drug, or tobacco use during pregnancy

- First-time pregnancy after age 35
- Diabetes in pregnancy


